Spirit of Carol Sigelman Award

Sharyn Goodson is the Senior Vice President of Philanthropy at the Jewish Community Foundation of San Diego (JCF). She oversees many of the foundation's programs and services, which aim to build thriving Jewish communities

and promote sustainable, equitable, and vibrant societies in San Diego, Israel, nationally, and globally.

Sharyn rejoined JCF after nine years serving as Vice President of Philanthropy at the Leichtag Foundation.

Her previous roles include Vice President of Philanthropy at the Jewish Community Foundation, Director of Grants at Jewish Family Service of San Diego, and Program Director at Aspen Community Foundation in Aspen, CO.

Sharyn is a Certified Fund Raising Executive (CFRE), a Certified Facilitator through the Association of Fundraising Professionals, and a certified Nonprofit Board Consultant through BoardSource.

In recognition of her collaborative leadership, ethical stewardship, and commitment to strengthening the nonprofit sector, NCPC is proud to honor Sharyn Goodson as this year's Carol Sigelman Award recipient.

REMEMBERING CAROL

Carol Sigelman was a true development professional. She helped open the Children's Museum of San Diego and grow the Palomar Pomerado Health Foundation. Carol served on the boards of NCPC and of Nonprofit Management Solutions. She was president of the Torrey Pines High School Foundation where she was known as the "godmother of the foundation." She was also their first paid executive.

Carol passed away in 2005. As a tribute to her, the NCPC Spirit of Carol Sigelman Award is given annually to a nonprofit professional in San Diego County who exemplifies the passion, integrity, wisdom and humor that Carol brought to all of us. We will always remember her motto, "Get the job done — and done well!"

Robert Krejci Standards of Excellence Award



Danny Sherlock

As President/Chief Executive Officer over the last 39 years, Danny Sherlock has grown the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater San Diego into one of the largest Boys & Girls Clubs in the nation. He has provided leadership for the merger of four independent Boys & Girls Club organizations into one.

Danny has been responsible for fundraising and construction of fifteen Boys & Girls Club facilities including clubhouses, gymnasiums, swimming pools, soccer arenas, a skate park and a teen center. Because of his efforts, the organization is serving over 22,000 young people each year at 22 locations across San Diego County.

Each year, the organization hosts two all-staff training events and at least 32 training workshops. His goal is to ensure that staff have the training and resources they need to provide quality services to our members. He also coaches other Boys & Girls Club professionals from around the country.

Danny is a man of integrity, humility and dependability. He doesn't just expect people to do as he says; he leads by example. It's easy for someone to call themselves a leader. It is much more difficult to be one. Danny doesn't consider himself to be extraordinary, but he is. He is a true leader.

REMEMBERING ROBERT

Bob had a distinguished career as a consultant and fundraising counselor for nonprofit, community service organizations. He served as a Boy Scout Executive for Councils until he joined the Cumerford Corporation as a professional fundraiser and public relations consultant for nonprofit groups. A Rotarian since 1950, he was instrumental in building the Rancho Bernardo Rotary Charitable Foundation.

In 1986, Bob Krejci and colleagues, Richard Henrickson and Myron Lewis, brought to life their vision of an organization to connect members of the local philanthropic community; founding the North County Philanthropy Council. Bob passed away in December 2011.

As a tribute to his leadership, NCPC has created the Robert Krejci Standards of Excellence Award which is presented to an individual who has demonstrated outstanding civic and charitable responsibility to North County.



SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARDS

Bo Mazzetti Impact Award



Bo Mazzetti (1947–2025) was the longtime Chairman of the Rincon Band of Luiseño Indians, leading the tribe for more than 16 years and championing tribal sovereignty, economic development, and regional partnerships.

A Vietnam veteran, he also helped secure a historic San Luis Rey Indian Water Rights settlement while serving as President of the San Luis Rey Indian Water Authority.

He was a founding force behind statewide and regional tribal leadership bodies, including the California Tribal Chairpersons' Association and the Southern California Tribal Chairmen's Association (president), uniting voices across Indian Country.

Under his stewardship, Rincon strengthened its philanthropic presence and guided key enterprises that support community well-being. Bo was widely respected for integrity, bridge-building, and a steadfast commitment to future generations—a legacy that continues to inspire our region.

About the Award

Introducing the Bo Mazzetti Impact Award.

Created in honor of Bo Mazzetti's lifelong commitment to community, partnership, and service, the Bo Mazzetti Impact Award recognizes an organization or individual that has meaningfully served the Indigenous community or another marginalized community in our region.

Honorees demonstrate culturally responsive engagement, center community voice, build respectful collaborations across sectors, and deliver measurable, lasting impact—whether through direct services, advocacy, education, or economic opportunity.

This award celebrates work that advances dignity and equity, strengthens trust, and opens doors for those historically underserved.

Presented at NCPC's Volunteer Awards Celebration (VAC), the Bo Mazzetti Impact Award uplifts leaders whose actions reflect courage, integrity, and a steadfast commitment to the well-being of all.
